

# Hudson Lakes Association Annual General Meeting Minutes Wednesday, July 30<sup>th</sup>, 2025 7:00 pm @ Hudson Hall

# Meeting was called to order at 7:07pm

- 5) President's Report Bill Ramsay

Bill provided an update to the members on the notification received on July 9<sup>th</sup> of a civil lawsuit against the Hudson Lakes Association. Katie Sullivan and her two sons are the plaintiffs. The incident of August 4<sup>th</sup>, 2024 was reported to our insurers on August 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024 and Bill Ramsay and Dana McLean met with the adjuster in September 2024. The Regatta Committee, HLA Directors and two guests met on July 10<sup>th</sup> and the decision was made to make further modifications to the Regatta Schedule and cancel the Sunday activities all together for this year and proceed with just the Saturday activities in collaboration with the Township. There were questions and discussion around the lawsuit and its implications for the HLA and its members.

In terms of the Township and the Official Plan, it is moving very slowly. We are still waiting to see a complete draft with the requested changes from Council. Planners from out-of-town draft these proposed plans and do not have full understanding of the community and our needs. It is better that things are done slowly and properly, rather than quickly and errors are made.

Hot topic right now is wind turbines. Dana will present information she has gathered in the last couple of months on the topic with the goal of being informed on both sides of the issue (pros and cons). In terms of the HLA this does not directly impact our area on the lakes, nor does it fall under our mandate.

We received a \$3000 grant from The Timiskaming Foundation for the Save Station project. Matt Duke applied with Agnico Eagle and we have been approved for \$7,500 from their social responsibility fund to support the Save Station project as well. The first Save Station will be at the top of Duke's driveway, as there is already hydro there which is required to ensure temperature control of the station. We would like to put one at the mailboxes and a third at Pike Lake Park. Both the mailboxes and the Park will require a financial investment to get hydro put in. Each Save Station will have an AED, epi-pen and Narcan kit.

Laurie Wilson shared that Paule Corneil would gladly offer a free session at the Hudson Hall to train people on how to use the AED and basic CPR.

# 6) Treasurer's Report – Laurie McLean

Treasurer presented the Report. Balance as of this morning, July 30, 2025 is \$12,862.79 which includes \$3000 from the TTF for the Save Station project. Fees that were paid today etc... are not included in this total.

# 11) Guest Speaker - Update on Windmills - Dana McLean

Dana McLean, Councillor for Hudson Township has actively been researching wind turbines. She has travelled to areas in which wind turbine projects exist, stood next to them, recorded the noise they make and asked questions of those who host the wind turbines on their properties. She shared her findings both negative and positive. Dana shared that she still has many questions and the companies making proposals would need to answer those questions for her to be able to make an informed decision on the topic. Currently the wind turbine companies require a motion from Council that gives them permission to investigate the possibility of a wind turbine project in Hudson. Providing the approval for the studies to be done etc... does not guarantee that a wind turbine project will happen in Hudson but rather allows the company to do the research and answer the questions with information specific to our township. The Township still can decline the project further down the road in the process.

Stewart Smith from Fairy Lake who lives down south with a wind turbine in "his backyard" (it is about 500 meters away from his home) shared his concerns with wind turbines when they were first proposed in his area. He now lives with one right next to his home and he has not personally experienced any negative impacts.
